New Survey for Young People to Talk about Swindon

A new survey is being launched to ask Swindon's young people how they feel. The 6 simple questions ask young people how much they feel listened to and involved, as well as for ideas to help improve things.

The survey marks the launch of Swindon Youth Voice, a new project to help young people grow in confidence and be able to make a difference to the world around them.

Project Manager Lisa Gibbons says it's important to know how young people feel about life in the town.

"We would love to know how involved Swindon's children and young people feel in their communities at the moment" she said. "We are hoping as many 11 to 25-year-olds as possible in Swindon will complete the survey."

The project will run workshops, discussions, creative activities and a programme of visits and guest speakers, all designed to help young people have their voice heard.

"This project will be an important step in getting young people's voices heard in Swindon" says Andy Malcolm from SMASH youth project. "We want to make sure that people from every background and every community can get involved."
