Training Courses at VAS

VAS offers a range of training courses for the local voluntary and community sector, including Fire Safety, First Aid at Work, Food Safety, Health & Safety, Life Support, Lone Working, and Manual Handling. Last year, we ran 11 courses attended by 50 people from the local voluntary sector.

Our training courses are aimed at the local voluntary sector, and are therefore heavily subsidised (typical course prices are £45 for a half day course, £95 for a full day course).

Some of our most popular courses include:



First Aid at Work

Make sure you are able to respond confidently to a range of first aid incidents and emergencies. This course will teach you the skills and knowledge to give emergency first aid in a low-risk work environment.



Fire Safety

Learn essential knowledge about fire safety, including carry out a fire safety risk assessment, implement appropriate fire precautionary and protection measures and maintain a fire management plan.



Health & Safety

All employers are required to have the correct systems in place to ensure a healthy and safe working environment for employees and any other people who may be affected by their business activities.

Manual Handling




VAS id

Sector Support

Some of our achievements in the last year:



We helped a range of local organisations including the Swindon Carers Centre, Shine PND, Nepalese Community, Swindon Fencing Club, Toothill Junior Youth Club and the Pride of Swindon Awards secure funding totalling £186,380.



We supported 110 people directly with funding and governance advice including help on safeguarding, gift aid advice and to become formally incorporated or constituted including the Swindon Bhaktapur Friendship Group, Swindon Food Collective, IPSUM, Open Door, Toothill Junior Youth Club, Renew and Butterflies Families Matter.



We continued to provide representation to the Swindon Equality Advisory Group, supported the development of Swindon City of Sanctuary, including during refugee week. We helped the campaign to encourage LBGTQ+ people to speak out and report domestic violence and we delivered a Knife Crime rally and an education programme in schools around the effects of knife crime.

We delivered 11 training courses to 50 attendees as well as facilitating DBS checks, delivering PAT testing and supporting a range of community groups with their printing and copying needs.


